Land Management Orders

- 1996 the Minister vested a number of reserves to the Shire recreation, recreation and foreshore management and pedestrian pathways.
- Section 46 of the Land Administration Act WA "The Minister may by order place with any one person or jointly with any 2 or more persons the care, control and management of a reserve for the same purpose as that for which the relevant Crown land is reserved under section 41 and for purposes ancillary or beneficial to that purpose and may in that order subject that care, control and management to such conditions as the Minister specifies".
- 8 pieces of land on West Island and 2 on Home Island

Pink is Commonwealth land vested to Shire under Management Order




West Island Overview

Issues

- Cost to maintain the land significant
- No specific funding from Commonwealth to manage land
- Significant risk to Shire associated with coastal erosion
- Need to consider benefit to the community
- Shire does not have the funding, resources or expertise to adequately manage the risk associated with the land within the Management Order.

Options

• Section 50 of the Land Administration Act, the Shire can request the Management Order be revoked

50. Management order, revocation of

- (1) When a management body
 - (a) agrees that its management order should be revoked; or
 - (b) does not comply with its management order or with a management plan which applies to its managed reserve or does not submit a management plan in compliance with a request made under section 49(2),

the Minister may by order revoke that management order.

- Need to be by resolution of Council
- Shire does not have the funding, resources or expertise to adequately manage the risk associated with the land within the Management Order reference to CHRMAP process
- It may be that we still undertake the work on the sites on behalf of the Commonwealth but it wouldn't be our
 responsibility


Waste Management

WI Boat Ramp

Temporary Options

FAUN TRACKWAY

- \$80,000
- 6 month lead time
- Lightweight aluminium
- Can be rolled out as and when required

C40 TRACKWAY®

CAPABILITY

C40 Trackway®;

- Is a temporary modular roadway which enables the rapid deployment and recovery of vehicles and people.
- Is suitable for all road legal wheeled vehicles, cranes and plant equipment.
- The beam dispenser facilitates the launch and recovery of the Trackway® using a host machine via a specifically designed adaptor plate or can be manually deployed and recovered using laying trolley.
- Designed to be constantly reused and has a long operational life in excess of 40 years.





- Is a modular system comprising of single aluminum panels connected by male/female joints and secured by locking pins. Individual panels can be easily removed or replaced as required.
- Has half panels every 5m; which facilitate easy splitting and joining to create the length required.
- Provides a high traction surface.
- Is supplied flat-packed, rolled for manual deployment or coiled onto an optional spool for mechanised deployment.







SPECIFICATION

- Is designed to withstand repeated passes of vehicles with a gross weight up to 100 tonnes (220,500lbs), with maximum axle loads of 13 tonnes (28,665lbs).
- Withstands ambient temperatures ranging from -40°c to +60°c.
- Does not float and therefore suitable for use in flowing tidal waters.
- Is 100% recyclable and has residual value at the end of its useful life.
- Is easily cleaned due to the open nature of the profile, minimising retention of mud and debris.
- Is anodised to 20 micron as standard to prevent oxidisation.

Temporary Options

Mobi Mat

- \$40,000
- 6 month lead time
- Polyester matting





Accessories & Anchorage included in the kit:





Mobi-Road Medium Grade A2Xis recommended for creating temporary access roads and working platforms for light and medium weight vehicles on driveable but unstable ground that even has a light gradient. Or for heavier vehicles on flat unstable ground such as sand, gravel or grass.

The Mobi-Road Medium Grade A2X is securely attached to the ground with stakes and staples inserted through eyelets.

Both ends of every mat are equipped with a specific fitting for easy and simple connection to another roll of MobiRoad.









Temporary Options

Concrete Matting

- \$15000
- Available now
- Concrete and geogrid combination
- Difficult to reuse/relay
